We are asking anyone who wishes to participate, to submit up to 5 images which meet the criteria above.

Digital files should be submitted as high quality jpegs in sRGB colourspace. Maximum dimensions are 1024 pixels wide horizontally and 768 pixels tall vertically.

Judging will take place shortly afterward by members of the Northwood Art Selection Committee. All entrants must be prepared, if your picture is selected, to submit a new physical print ranging in size from 5x7 to 11x14 (at the photographer's expense). It will be matted and framed by Northwood, tagged with the title of the print and name of the artist, and displayed permanently in the new facility in West Bedford.
